



**Part-Time Paid NYU Law Student Internship  
New York Women's Bar Association Foundation  
Spring Semester 2008**

**Position Description:** InMotion seeks a part-time NYU Law Student Intern for the spring semester 2008 to serve as the New York Women's Bar Association Foundation (NYWBAF) Fellow. This position would require 10-20 hours per week. The internship is funded by the NYWBAF at a rate of \$2,000 for the semester (paid in two installments).

**Organization Description:** InMotion is a non-profit agency providing free legal services to low-income women throughout New York City, primarily in the areas of matrimonial, family and immigration law; the majority of the women served are survivors of domestic violence. InMotion recruits, trains and mentors volunteer lawyers, legal assistants and law students to provide legal assistance. InMotion also trains and mentors clients to advocate for themselves when self-representation is likely to result in a favorable outcome. Informed by this work, inMotion promotes policies that make our society more responsive to the legal issues confronting women.

**Position Responsibilities:** The Intern will work under the direction of inMotion's staff attorneys and Legal Director. The intern's job will be varied depending on her/his interests and inMotion's program needs. Possible assignments include assisting with in-house trainings at large law firms, as well as client intake, case assessment, and brief legal services. The intern may be actively involved in our community outreach efforts in all boroughs by helping to organize and conduct information sessions and community outreach programs for community-based organizations on topics of interest to these groups, such as how to secure an order of protection in Family Court. The intern may assist with updating program materials and manuals. The intern may also assist clients with securing uncontested divorces or immigration status through a VAWA self-petition.

**Qualifications:**

- NYU School of Law Student.
- Good interpersonal and organizational skills, self-starter, and highly motivated.
- Knowledge of family, matrimonial and/or immigration law or domestic violence helpful but not required.
- Ability to work collaboratively and independently.
- Bilingual English/Spanish a plus.
